Who can comment:

Township residents and property owners, as well as visitors and members of the public who care about the Loyalsock Valley, our communities, wildlife, forests and waterways. The Commonwealth owns a large amount of land in the township, which belongs to all Pennsylvanians.



Plunketts Creek Township is a prime destination for low impact, sustainable tourism and both full time and seasonal residency. The natural beauty of its forests, mountains, valleys and streams draws people from throughout the country and the world to hike, bird watch, hunt, fish, kayak, tube, swim and relax. Maintaining the natural assets will preserve these economic

opportunities and a high quality of life for residents and visitors.

Allowing the gas industry to proliferate in the Loyalsock Creek watershed puts exceptional value waterways, forest-covered mountains, wildlife, livestock, homes, health and lives at risk. **This industrialization will change the character of the township, most likely forever.**

Plunketts Creek Township supervisors and planning commission should be commended for their efforts to address oil and gas activities in the township.
